Spring Training for Grain Marketers

In a high-pressure game, winning often comes down to who makes fewer mistakes. That's also true with volatile grain markets. Seasoned ballplayers know you will enjoy more success if you stop swinging for the fences. Throughout this lively session Ed and Matt will help the audience understand the importance of a strong marketing plan grounded in fundamentals. In this session, World Record Holders Dave Hula and Randy Dowdy join longtime no-tiller and independent on-farm researcher, Marion Calmer, to discuss Calmer's 15-year study on surface-applied dry P&K fertilizer. His research has identified two alarming problems: 1) surface-applied P&K fertilizer leads to significant vertical stratification, showing that the vertical placement of





nutrients is more important than the rate, and 2) annual plant growth removes nutrients from the lower profile of the root zone and deposits them on the surface. These two problems create a vertical stratification of nutrients that is far more devastating to yields than any horizontal variability of P&K that is identified by grid sampling. Calmer will also provide solutions to this yield robbing problem.
